60 years of priesthood

Last June, Father Richard Morrow celebrated 60 years as a priest. The packed Cathedral was a stunning tribute to Father Morrow's priesthood which has touched so many lives over his 17 assignments (ten as pastor) in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. Father Morrow's joy of priesthood was tangible in the celebration.

Although the Cathedral parish has been blessed with Father Morrow's presence for the past 19 years, it was a twist of fate and obedience to a Bishop that landed him at Christ the King. In 1996, Father Morrow was ready to semi-retire and he picked out a parish which he thought perfect for his needs. Archbishop Donoghue at first agreed but three weeks before moving day, Father Morrow got the call that he was going to Christ the King instead of his chosen parish. Not only that, then pastor Monsignor Kenny called him up and asked if he could come before the Olympics as they were shorthanded and Father Morrow was needed. Father Morrow obeyed his Bishop and changed his plans, arriving at the Cathedral one month before the Olympics began. *He has been needed ever since*.

Reminiscing about his years at the Cathedral, Father Morrow notes the growth of the parish, particularly among young singles and young families. The congregation is more diverse now, but the parishioners' love of their faith has been constant. When asked what he looks forward to most, he says he wants to "be with the people." He is invigorated by them and likes being called "Father" as this denotes that we are all family. Father Morrow has a special affinity to those who are sick, visiting Piedmont Hospital on a frequent and regular basis. His eyes sparkle as he confirms that he has witnessed many miracles there, some physical and many spiritual.

As gracious and kind as Father Morrow is, there is one thing that you will never get from him – an email. He promised Monsignor Kenny (who spent hours each day answering emails) that he would never have an

email address, and he has kept that promise. His concession to "being wired" is a cell phone but he prefers his old phone and answering machine.

The Cathedral parish family is truly blessed that Father Morrow was obedient to the Bishop so many years ago and came to Christ the King. This gentle and humble priest has guided us, nurtured us and shown us God's unending love through his service here and throughout the Archdiocese. We will be a happy congregation to call him "Father" for years and years to come.

From the founding days of Christ the King parish almost 80 years ago, the central focus of the parish has always been its liturgies and the celebration of the sacraments. From the splendid architecture to the mighty organ, we come to know God through our liturgies and observances. At every Mass, the priest intones, "Do this in memory of me." We remember that Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice for us and gave us the Mass and the sacraments to strengthen and encourage us.

Christ the King parish offers many opportunities to participate in the ministries which center around liturgies and the sacraments. These include Choirs, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Lectors, Flower Guild, Funeral Guild, and so many more.

During the past year, there were 422 Baptisms, 371 First Communions, 263 Confirmations, 128 Marriages and 30 Funerals. Ten choirs, 125 volunteer musicians, 250 Altar Servers, 375 Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and 200 lectors support our 11 weekend Masses, 21 weekday Masses and other special liturgies at the Cathedral. There are over 1,000 volunteers serving the Cathedral through sacred liturgies. The new web-casting ministry will potentially touch the lives of thousands of the Faithful who are unable to attend masses.

"As a young girl, my sister and I sang in the choir under the direction of Dr. Tim Wissler. We watched many beautiful weddings from the choir loft and loved seeing the brides walk down the long, elegant aisle of the Cathedral.

When it came time to plan my own wedding, I couldn't believe it was my turn to be the bride walking down that same aisle. One of my favorite memories of wedding planning was meeting with Dr. Wissler in the choir loft to go over music selections for our special day. On the day of my wedding, the Cathedral was transformed with amazing flowers from the Flower Guild, who specifically reached out to all the brides marrying on that day to make sure the arrangements would complement their bridal parties' color schemes. Aaron and I will always look back at our wedding day at the Cathedral of Christ the King as the best day of our lives, and it could not have been more perfect."

Reaching Out

The recent dedication of our new Hispanic Mission was a joyful celebration of our shared faith. After years of searching for a home for our Hispanic brothers and sisters who cannot make the trip to Christ the King, the parish reached out to them, securing leased space close to their neighborhoods. The new Mission, Cristo Rey, is located on Buford Highway behind the Northeast Plaza Shopping Center. Father Feiser Muñoz enthusiastically leads our Hispanic Ministry at Christ the King, and he and his congregation have worked miracles in transforming the space. Hispanic artisans have donated their time to craft the beautiful altar, tabernacle and other items. Father Feiser is not shy about asking for help and many of our Cathedral ministries are supporting this new Mission with their time and treasure. We join the Hispanic community in joyful celebration of their new space and our shared faith.

There are 307 Hispanic elementary PSR, 33 Hispanic Middle School PSR, 79 Hispanic High School PSR, 106 First Communions, 23 RCIA Catechumens, 61 RCIA Candidates, 59 Eucharist Ministers, 23 Altar Servers, 54 Ushers, 9 Greeters, 23 Choir Members, and 47 Lectors.

We also celebrate our faith through our outreach to the wider community. Many Cathedral ministries address poverty, hunger and loneliness through programs such as Adopt-A-Family, Habitat for Humanity builds, lunch programs, CTK Buddies, and more.

A prime focus for our Outreach Ministries was providing food and shelter to those in need. We built our 16th Habitat House with over 120 volunteers. Sandwich making included 8,000 lunches prepared by 320 volunteers, 2,500 snack bags were readied by 60 volunteers, and 350 volunteers made 5,000 sandwiches for local shelters. Our nearby eight Senior High-Rise Facilities, Piedmont Hospital and Shepherd Center were served by clergy and 46 volunteers through Masses, Communion Services and visits. Eight Stephen Ministry trained volunteers walked the journey with 17 individuals dealing with grief, divorce or other life changing events.

We as Catholics believe that one day, we will attain "everlasting life" through knowing and serving God on earth. We must continually educate ourselves, learning about our faith. So many Cathedral ministries encourage this learning such as RCIA, CRHP, Life Teen, Living Your Strengths, Bible Studies, Sunday Night Live and Vacation Bible School. In addition to educating our minds, we must be aware of our physical health. Our Recreation Ministry offers all ages the opportunity to stay fit and exercise through programs such as youth soccer, basketball, volleyball, and adult basketball and yoga.

We have 106 teachers and 1,153 children in Elementary Catechesis, 126 middle schoolers in EDGE, 243 teens in Life Teen, 24 Upperclassmen Empower leaders, 35 teens involved in Discipleship, 32 young adult core team volunteers, 7 volunteers and 325 attendees for CTK Believes, 244 volunteers and CRHP members, 22 volunteers and 252 Life Teen members, 67 RCIA volunteers and 50 participants, 250 involved in our many Bible Studies and almost 1,500 joining us for our Coffeehouse Ministry. We have 531 young people participating in our sports programs, and 230 participate in extracurricular activities for youth and adults.

"I was signed up for Life Teen because I was getting confirmed. Through the course of the year I met so many awesome core members who mentored me. I had a lot of questions and doubts, but they helped me work through them. I met some of my best friends who now share the same passion for Jesus as I do. I was surrounded by the core members who were on fire with their faith, and a good group of teens who wanted to grow closer to Jesus. This year I'm signed up for Life Teen EMPOWER in hopes of helping other teens to join me in the CTK family."

Preserving Our Treasures through the Cathedral Fund

One of the most unique assets of the Cathedral is its stained glass windows. Truly they are "The Jewels of the Cathedral," and their preservation is both a privilege and a burden. Our windows were buckling and in danger of falling apart. As stewards of what we have been given, we could not let this happen. The \$1.6 million needed to restore the windows came from the Cathedral Fund, a fund for temporary and permanently restricted donations.

Over the past two and a half years, each stained glass window in the church was carefully removed, meticulously restored and then reinstalled in its original place in the Cathedral. The majority of the work and cost, \$1.2 million, happened during this past fiscal year. The work is now complete and when light hits these restored windows, the "Jewels of the Cathedral" are radiant once again.

Coming soon to the Cathedral....

There are many sounds we hear in the Cathedral every day including praying and singing. But there is one sound that is about to go away and no one will miss it. It is the ear-shattering bang when heavy oak kneelers hit the terrazzo floor. Yes, we will be installing new kneelers which will silently move up and down without any noise or any crushing of legs and feet. And we will all say Alleluia!
