### Prayer and Liturgical Ministries

Our faith is deeply rooted in our prayer life, both individually and as a parish family. Knowing Jesus requires being willing to grow in our faith through prayer and study.

Christ the King parish offers many opportunities to grow spiritually such as daily Mass, Perpetual Adoration, the Rosary Group, Legion of Mary, Bible studies and many, many more.

Over 2,000 Masses were celebrated during the past year attended by 243,000 participants. Our many choirs added their joyful voices to these occasions as did liturgical ministers, ushers, sacristans and all those actively involved in liturgy.

#### Spreading our Faith

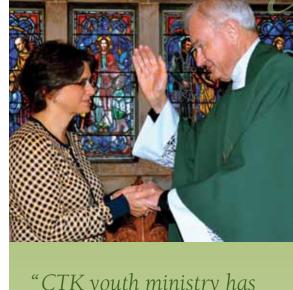
There are over 5,000 families in our Cathedral parish with a growth rate averaging 7% a year. We are a diverse and vibrant group, welcoming all who come to our doors. Loving God and neighbor, as Jesus commands us to do, means reaching out to others using our current programs and ministries with an eye toward future ways to continue God's plan for this parish.

During this past year, our Children's and Youth Ministries have grown and prospered, helping our young people to understand and embrace our faith with innovative, fun programs. Some examples are Vacation Bible School for little ones, and our EDGE and Life Teen programs for our teenagers.

Adult programs and events such as *Christ Renews His Parish (CRHP)*, Living Your Strengths program, CTK Coffeehouse and Sunday Night Live help us to know and love our neighbor.

Last year, our leaders had the resources to seek out, evaluate and implement new opportunities and ministries that enhance what has been offered in the past.

#### Reaching Out

The strength of our Cathedral family is demonstrated through our prayer, fellowship and good works. From adopting families at Christmastime to making lunches for hungry families, parishioners worked together to make the Cathedral the spiritual, vibrant, growing community of today. The original 400 founding families gave us a legacy, not only of bricks and mortar, but a determination of spirit to be about God's work.

Last year, *CTK Coffeehouses* were introduced the first Sunday of each month, allowing parishioners to meet and mingle. *Sunday Night Live* has provided both a social gathering and faith formation. Also this past year, parishioners began to connect in a new way with the *CTK Atlanta* smartphone app. We engaged parishioners using technology and social media outlets such as Facebook and Twitter to help them know, love and serve as Jesus did.

#### Income

Our Cathedral parish is blessed by the generosity of our parish families. Offertory collections funded 87% of the dollars required to support the operations, ministries and pastoral work of our parish. The remainder came from the Ida Ryan Endowment, restricted donations, and registration fees paid for ministries.

#### **Expenses**

#### The Cathedral Church

The vibrancy of our Cathedral as a sacramental place was indicated by the numerous weekly Masses, weddings, penance and prayer services, adoration, confirmations, baptisms and other acts of faith that were held at the Cathedral in 2014. On average, \$62,000 or 48 cents of every dollar of income was needed per week to support these activities.

#### The Cathedral Ministries

Approximately 50% of the expenses in ministries are used to cover the development and growth of our youth in their Catholic faith. RCIA and the Adult Education and Evangelization ministries account for approximately 15% of ministry expenses. We welcomed 95 parishioners into our faith this year. Many more renewed their faith and continued their formation through such ministries as *Christ Renews His Parish*, *Sunday U*, and the Men's and Women's Bible Study programs. The remaining 35% of ministry expenses were allocated to support our Outreach, Pastoral Care, Fellowship, and Recreation programs.

#### The Wider Catholic Church

Approximately 23 cents of every gift dollar that the Cathedral receives in offertory supports the universal Catholic Church. In 2014, these funds supported Archdiocesan ministries such as vocations, Catholic Charities, Catholic Social Services and more.

#### The Cathedral Reserves

In 2013, a plan recommended by the Finance Council and approved by Monsignor McNamee was implemented to begin allocating any surplus income realized by the Cathedral to the Cathedral Reserves. These Reserves would be used to cover unforeseen expenses that, at Monsignor's discretion and via the guidance of the Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils, required immediate attention. In 2014, these reserves amounted to 10% of the total income, and a majority of these funds will be used to support the newly reformed and burgeoning Hispanic Mission.

# CAPITAL PROJECTS

Through the generosity of our parish family, we have been able to accomplish the following projects:

#### **Fulfilling our Call**

For years, the rented building that housed the Cathedral's Hispanic Mission at Lindbergh has been in disrepair. With no facility option, it appeared the parish would be unable to continue this mission. Great thanks to the Knights of Columbus Council 660 who stepped forward and, through a short-term lease, allowed the parish to continue to provide services to our Mission. At last count, over 400 families were attending Sunday Masses and over 200 children were attending the Mission's School of Religion. The Cathedral Finance Council will continue to seek a more permanent solution to meet the needs of this essential ministry.

#### Preserving Our Past through Restricted Gifts to the Cathedral Fund

Cathedral Renovations - Let There Be Light

Restoring the stained glass windows, the jewels of the Cathedral, will continue into 2015. This three year project has been very successful in preserving the windows and bringing them back to their original beauty. This project is estimated to cost \$1,600,000.

Through a generous gift from a member of our parish family, the Cathedral interior lighting has been completely renovated. Old fixtures have been restored and updated, and additional lighting has been added, brightening the sanctuary while increasing energy efficiency.

#### Preparing for the Future - Advancing our Master Plan

With the completion of the new rectory nearing in early 2015, planning continues for the future use of the entire East Wesley Corridor, which represents our greatest opportunity to expand our facilities within the current boundaries of our campus. In the interim, the existing rectory will be used to support the expansion of existing ministries, the growth of new ministries, and additional liturgical and social space. It will become the Parish Life Center.
