


10:30 AM & 12:00 PM | Cathedral Choir Ecce Quam Bonum, Proulx






Bread of the world, in mercy broken, Wine of the soul, in mercy shed, By Whom the words of life were spoken, And in Whose death our sins are dead.

O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, All praise and all thanksgiving, Be every moment Thine!


#### Memorare
